A review disclosed information regarding Juan Mari Bras under the initials J.M.B. However, the initials are not included on the front page of this summary since the complete name is set out.

The May, 1947 issue of "Puerto Rico" [REDACTED] in an article entitled, "Commemoration of the Massacre of Ponce" described ceremonies which took place in PR on 3/21/47. The article revealed that thousands of individuals visited the tombs of the "martyrs" in Ponce and in Mayaguez, and that Juan Maria Bras, the first speaker, advocated action as to the best tribute to the memory of those who died in Ponce for independence.

US Department of Agriculture, Washington, DC, furnished several clippings from a newspaper of PR, "El Mundo" [REDACTED] which had been received from Mr. U.S. Allison, Director, Caribbean Area, Soil Conservation Service, San Juan, PR. An article captioned "Students Picket Governor Pinero," dated 11/3/47, revealed that Juan Mari Bras of the University Independentists Society, spoke at a welcome meeting on the campus of the University where pickets had been organized. These students and various communists picketed the Chief Executive in front of the Executive Mansion in protest to the statements he made regarding Puerto Rican independence.

Also enclosed was a photostatic copy of another article from above newspaper captioned "Universitarios se uniran a los colegiales en piquete a Pinero," dated 10/23/47, which was written in Spanish, regarding Juan Mari Bras.

"El Imparcial," San Juan newspaper, dated 4/24/48, listed the names of nineteen students suspended from UPR because of their manifestations in seeking readmission of Juan Mari Bras and others who were expelled from the University on 12/15/47, for raising the Nationalist flag and demanding the resignation of the Chancellor of the University.


San Juan newspapers dated 5/10/48, (not further identified) published news items from NYC stating that committee of students attending US universities submitted an appeal to Roger Baldwin, President, Civil Liberties Union. The students urged attention to an incident at Puerto Rico University (redacted) alleging violation of civil rights by university authorities and insular government. Juan Mari Bras, expelled student and delegate to Latin American Youth Congress in Mexico City, reported as invited by student group in NYC to attend meeting there.







"El Imparcial" on 5/19/48, announced that Jose Ferrer

and other members of the Youth Congress of Mexico.




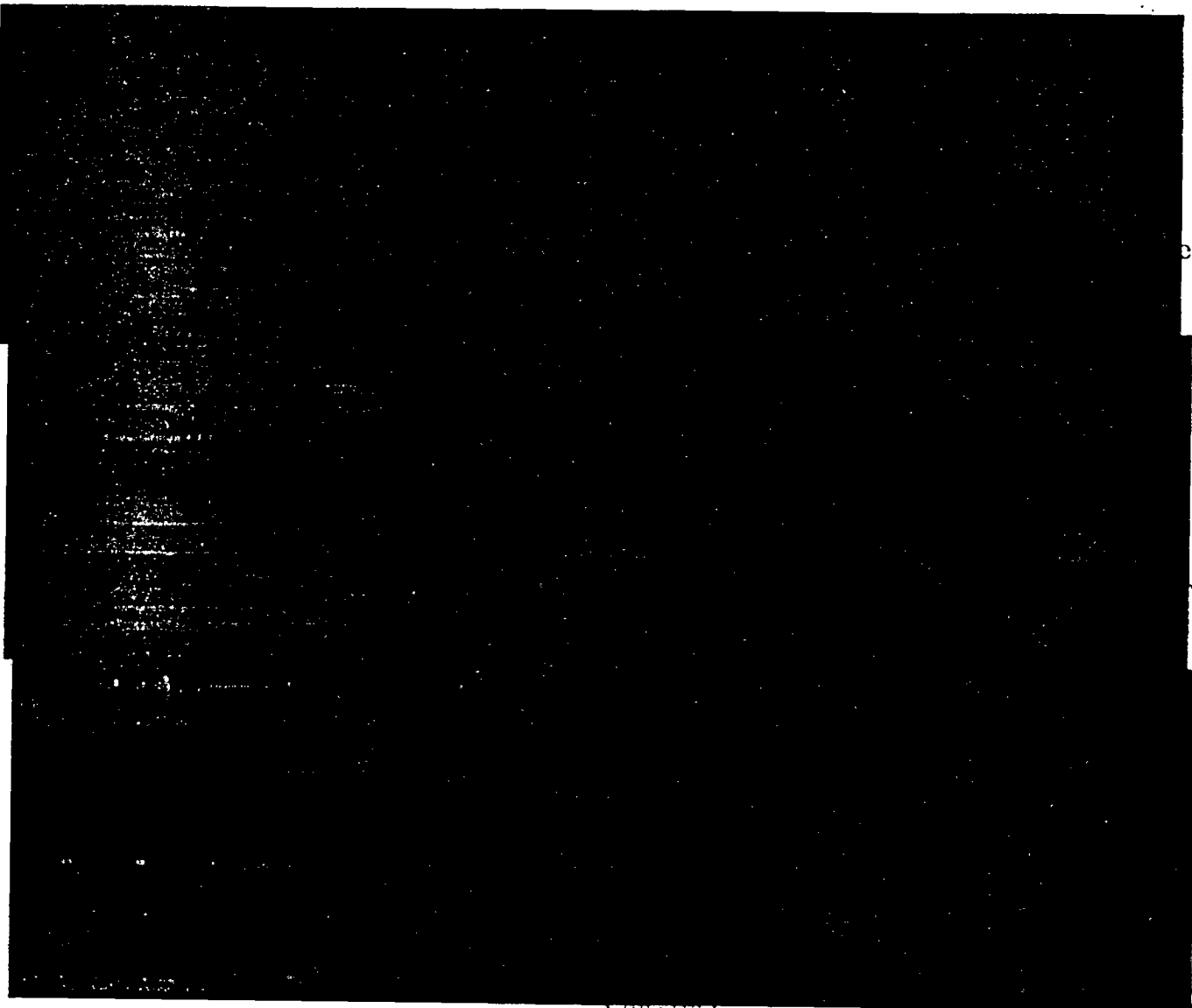


"El Imparcial," dated 10/28/57, carried an article captioned "Manrique Cabrera Says Crisis in PIP Dates from Before Elections." In explaining the reasons prompting his resignation from the positions he held in the PIP, Dr. Manrique Cabrera  stated he acted after meditating on the meaning and contents of the resignations of several comrades who were so extremely valuable to the party, who were indisputably devoted in their efforts in behalf of the work of independence, such as Juan Mari Bras.

It was noted that the PIP was a legally constituted political party which, according to its published platform and the public statements of its officers, advocated independence for PR through legal and peaceful means.



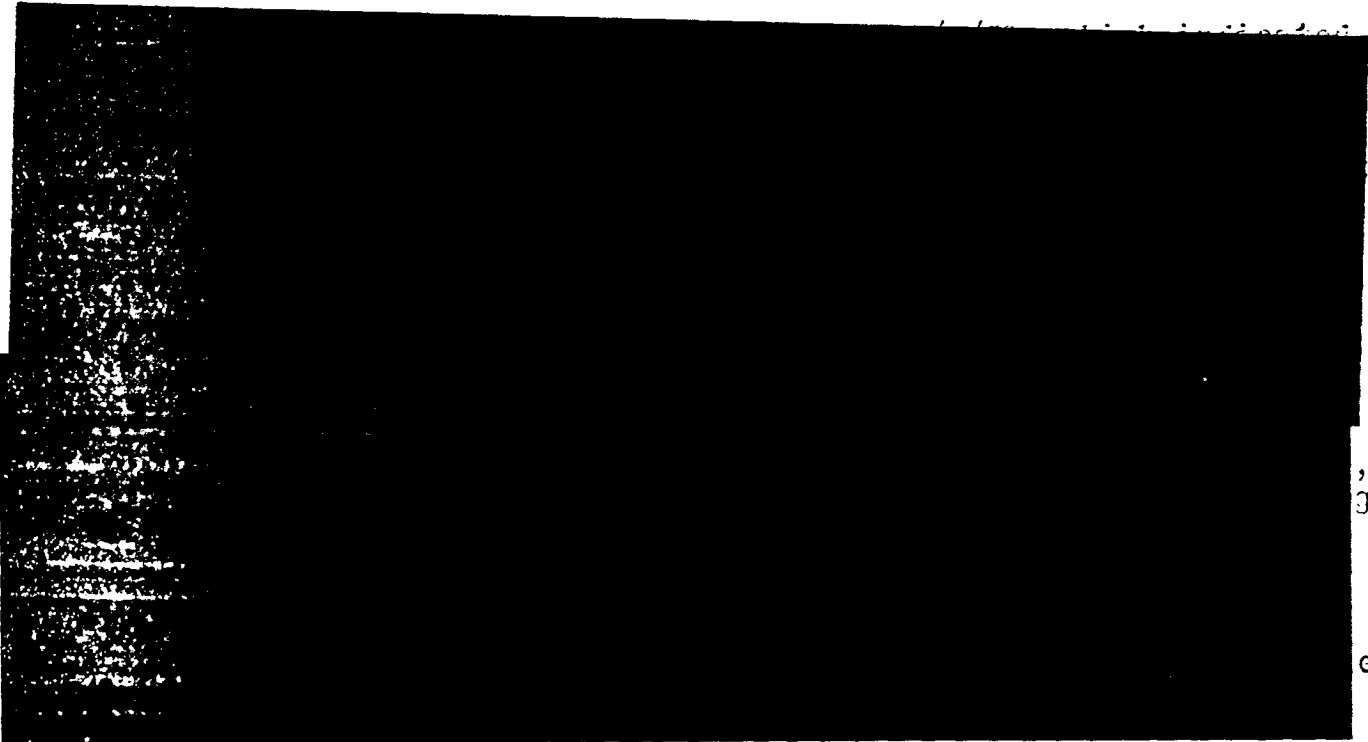

INS, NY, furnished information regarding an article which appeared in the fourth 1963 edition of "World Student News." This article was critical of the action taken in 1962 of the District Director of INS at San Juan in directing transportation companies to deny passage to two Puerto Ricans, one of whom was Juan Mari Bras. (No proposed travel or cause for the above action was indicated)

The "World Student News" was described as the official publication of the communist International Union of Students.

Narciso Rabell [REDACTED] was author of the above mentioned article which was captioned "Tightening the Screws in Puerto Rico."



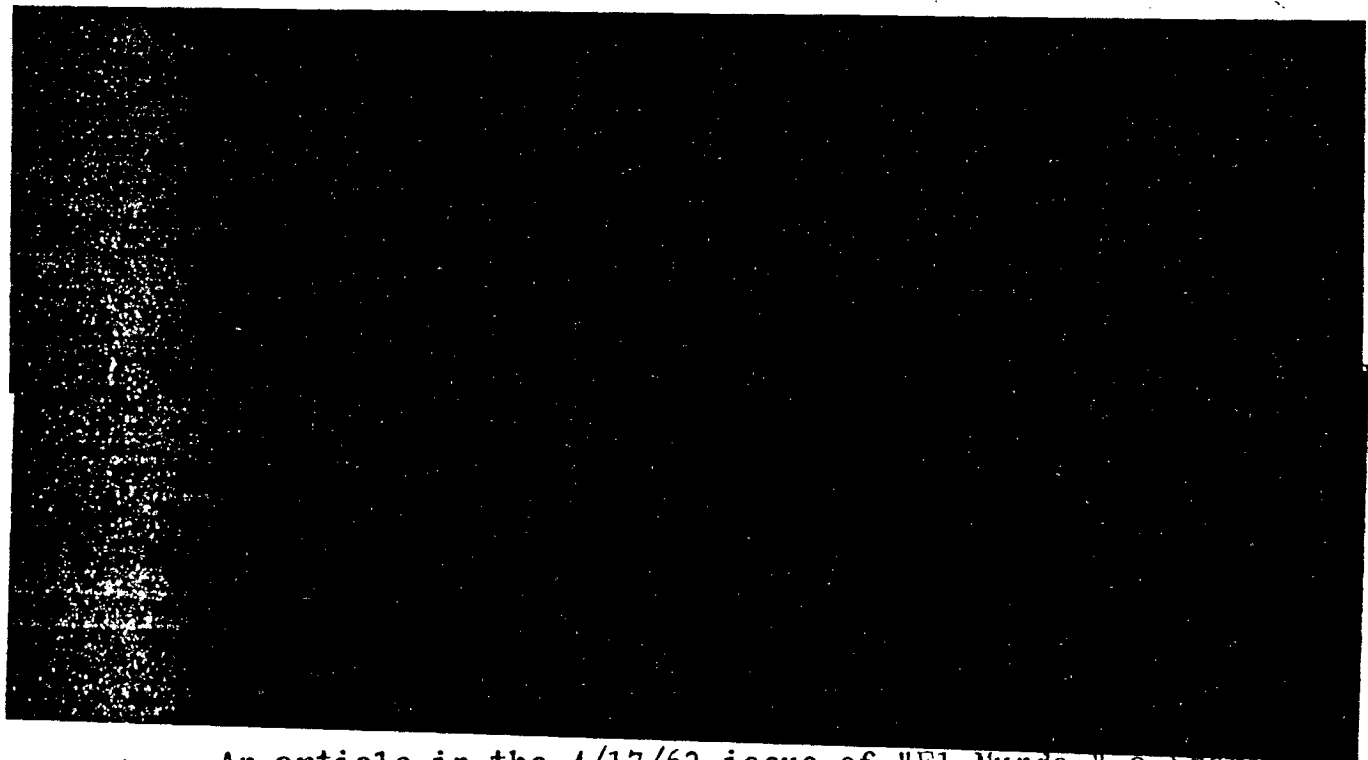

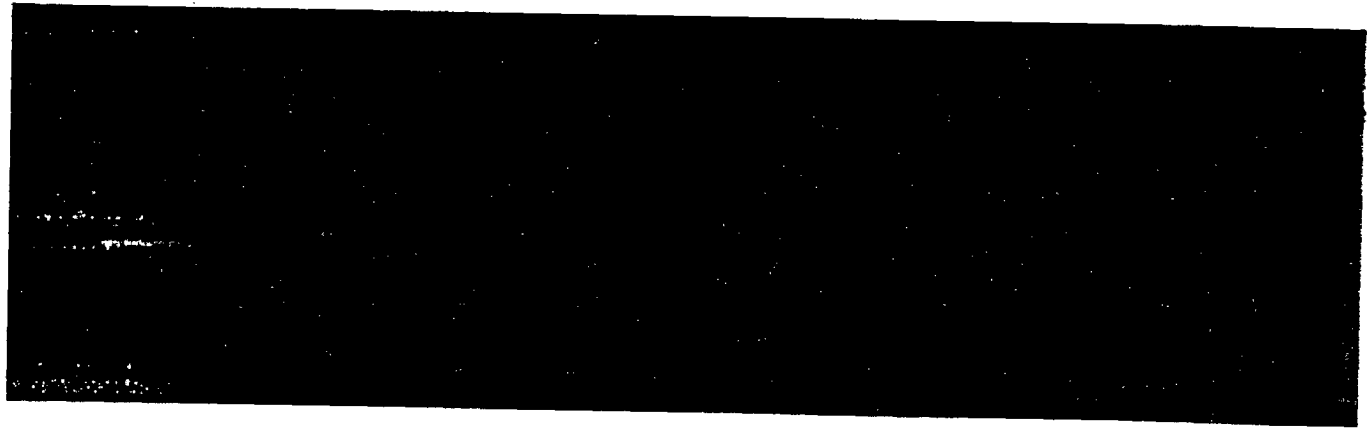
The "Carta Semanal" (Weekly Letter) of the MPIP, dated 3/1/63, revealed that during the weekend prior to above date, Juan Mari Bras visited Aguadilla, PR, and was in contact with the Aguada MPIP leader Angel Agudo [redacted] (No further information)

An article in the 4/17/63 issue of "El Mundo," a Spanish language newspaper published in San Juan, PR, captioned "Mari Bras Says No Independentist Will Testify Before US Committees," revealed that Juan Mari Bras spoke during the commemoration of the birthday of Dr. Ramon Emeterio Betances, in Cabo Rojo, PR. He stated that no MPIPR members and no Puerto Rican Independentists would testify before the HCUA or before the SISS, in PR or in Washington, DC. He attacked the Committees as being of "Mac Carthy Character," clearing the way for the establishment of fascism in the US.

This serial indicated that Betances was a revolutionary leader closely identified with both the Cuban and Puerto Rican revolutionary movements.



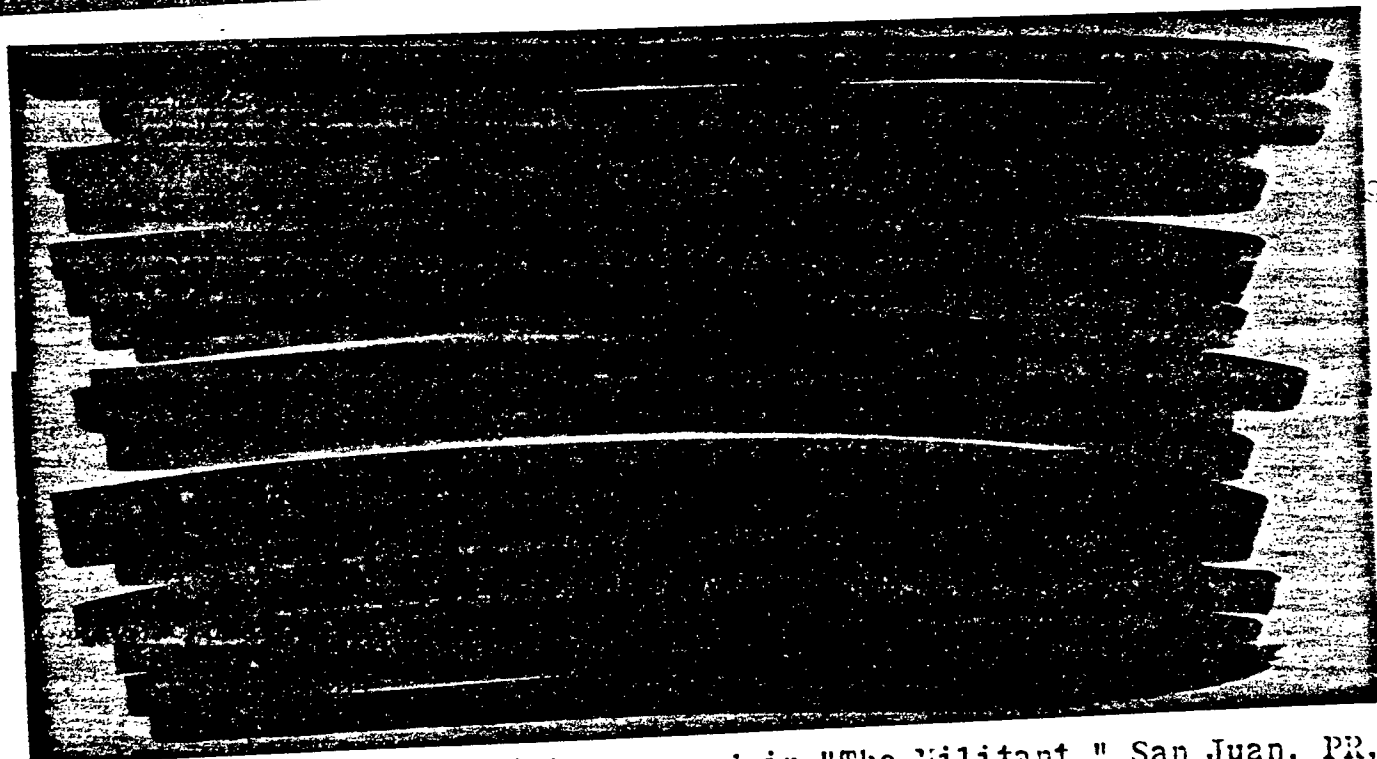
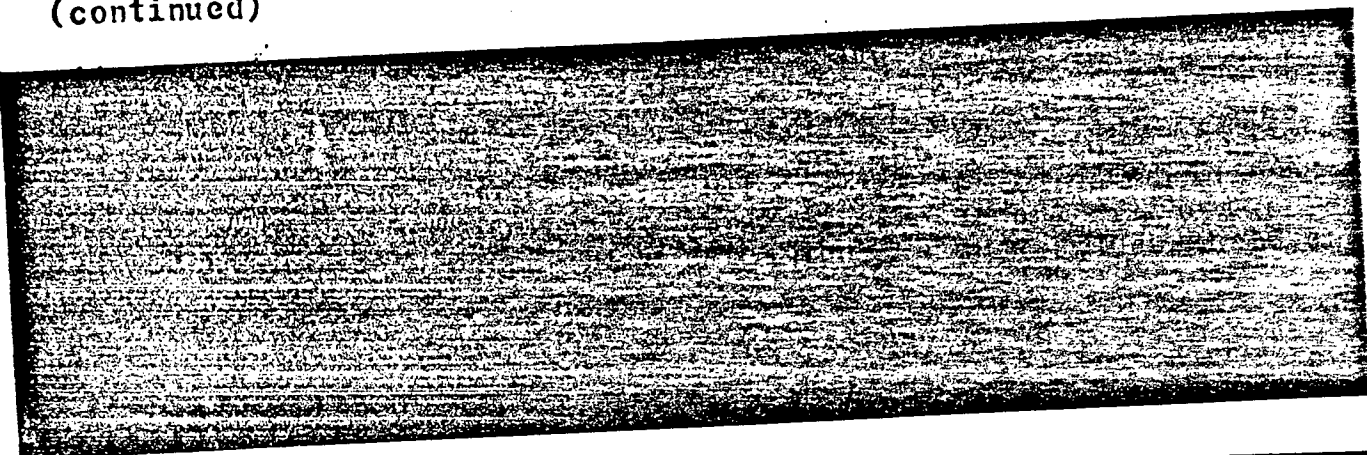

It was noted that Juan Mari Bras was absent from the island for approximately 10 days during the first part of July, 1963. While it was not known at that time where Mari Bras went on this trip, it was known that he returned to PR from NYC. Thus there existed the possibility that he contacted Mexican MP/IPR sympathizers in the US and even a slight chance that he went to Mexico during the trip. Mari Bras' unexplained and unannounced trip and other conditions, were possible explanations to the question of how the Mexican newspaper got the MP/IPR propoganda during the exact time it was pasted up in PR.

An article which appeared in "The Militant," San Juan, PR, dated 9/23/63, revealed that the Third National Conference of the Pro-Independence Youth Movement was held (no date or locality) and Juan Mari Bras, leader of the MIPR, who had just returned from a trip to Europe and Algeria, spoke. He declared that the youth represented at the conference would lead PR to independence and socialism.

On 9/28/63, Bureau Agents observed [redacted] in the company of Juan Mari Bras in NYC.

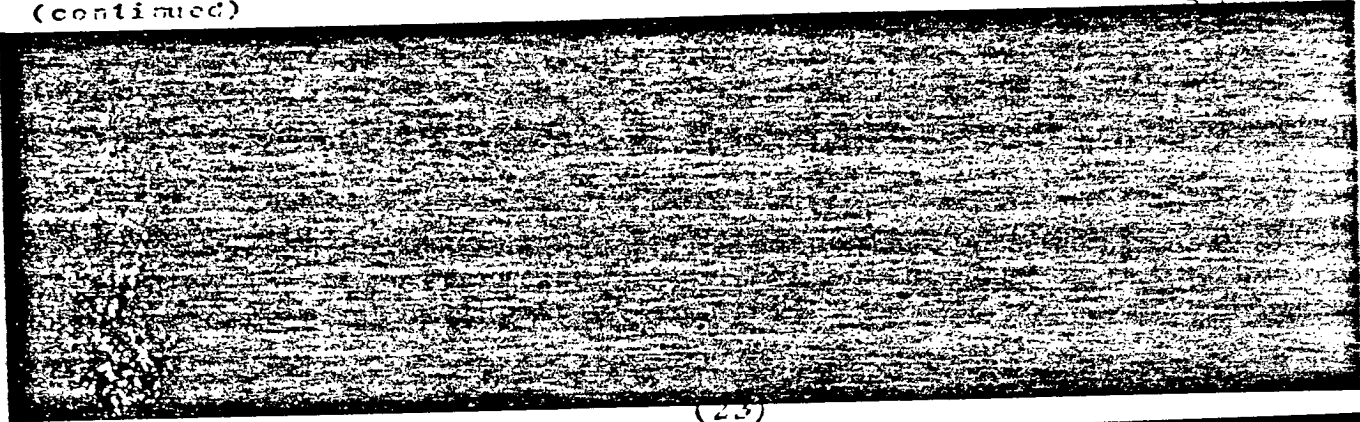
On-12/15/63, Bureau Agents observed [redacted] attending a meeting at MPIPR Headquarters in NYC with Mari Bras.

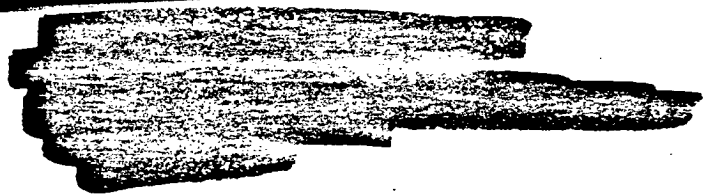

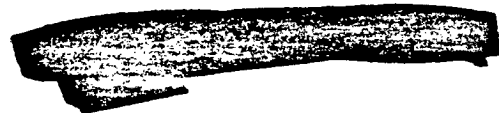

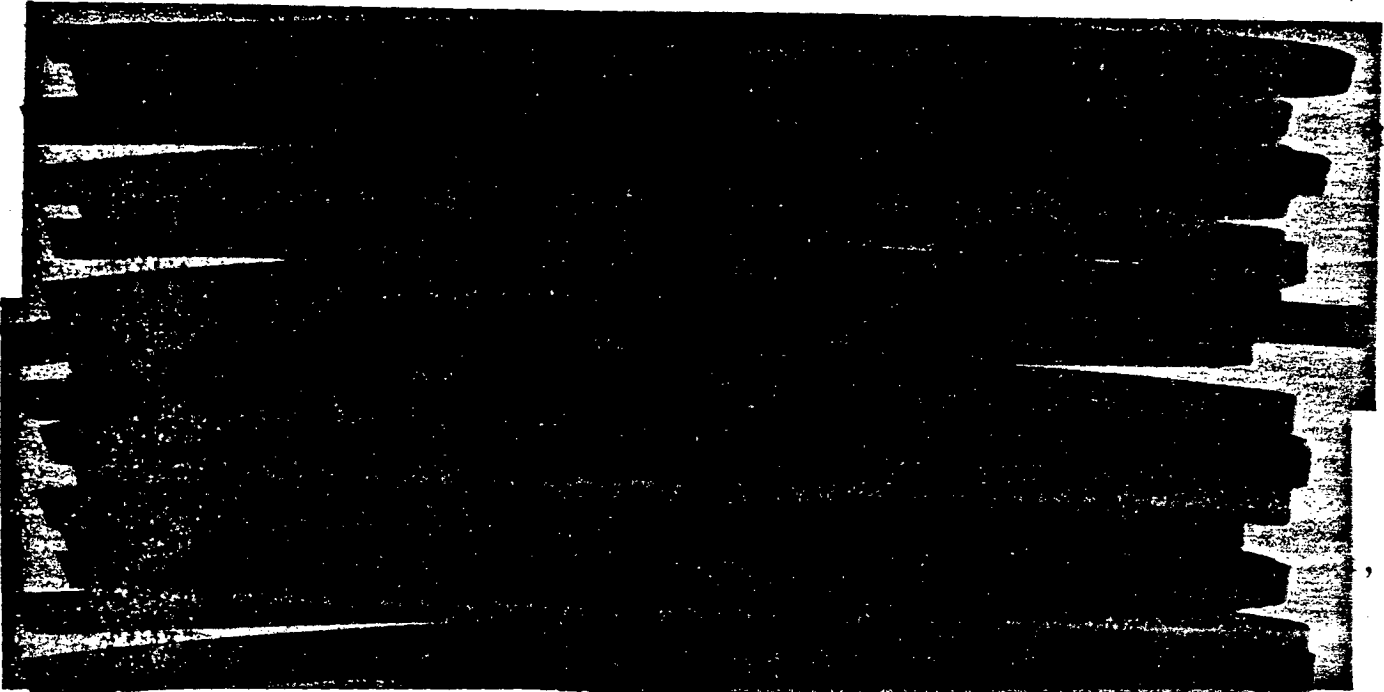
The 3/26/64 issue of "Carta Semanal" No. 148, revealed that Juan Mari Bras had been invited by the political science section of the Ateneo Puertorriqueno* to participate in a forum on "Freedom of the Press in Democracy" to be held on 5/4/64.

It was noted that the MPIPR "Carta Semanal" was self-described as the official weekly letter from MPIPR headquarters to the officials of its branch missions.

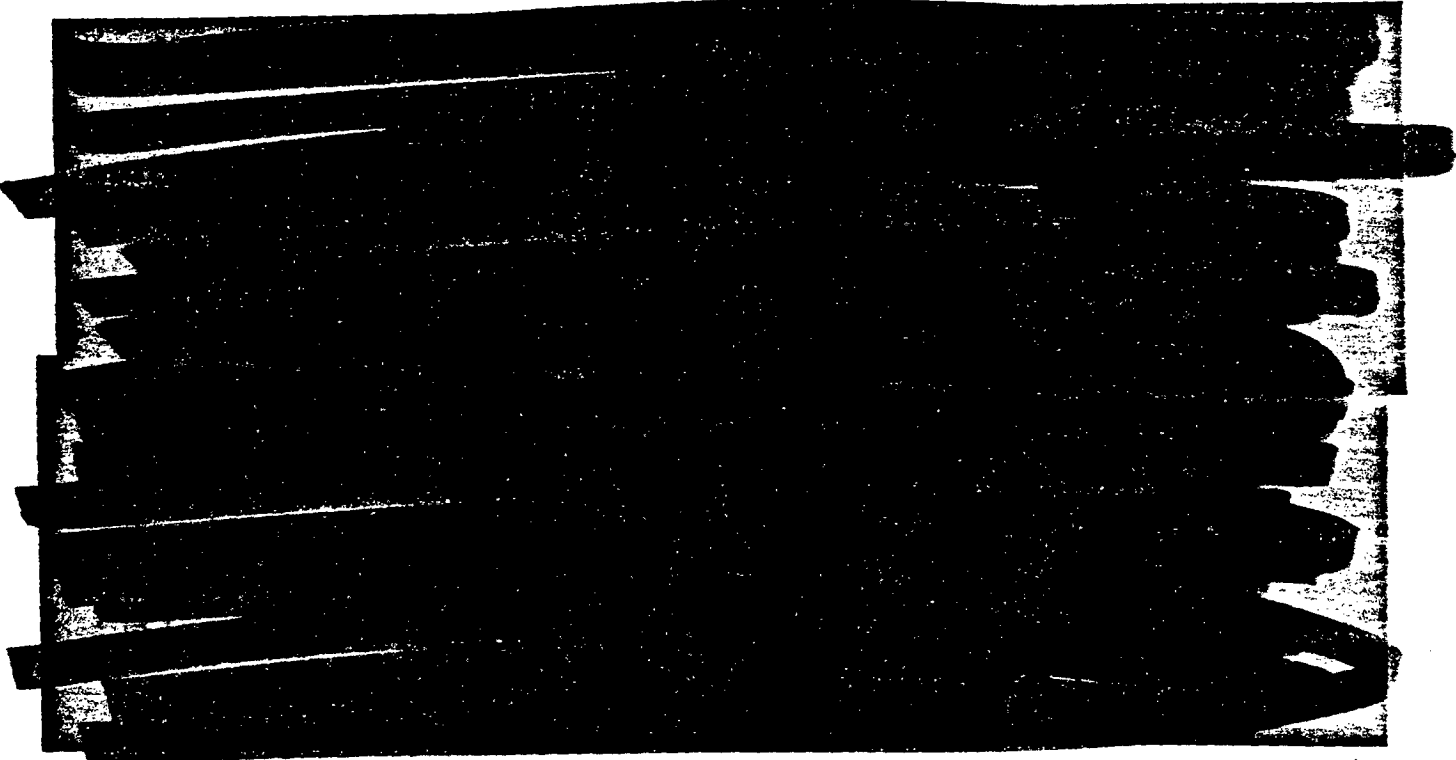

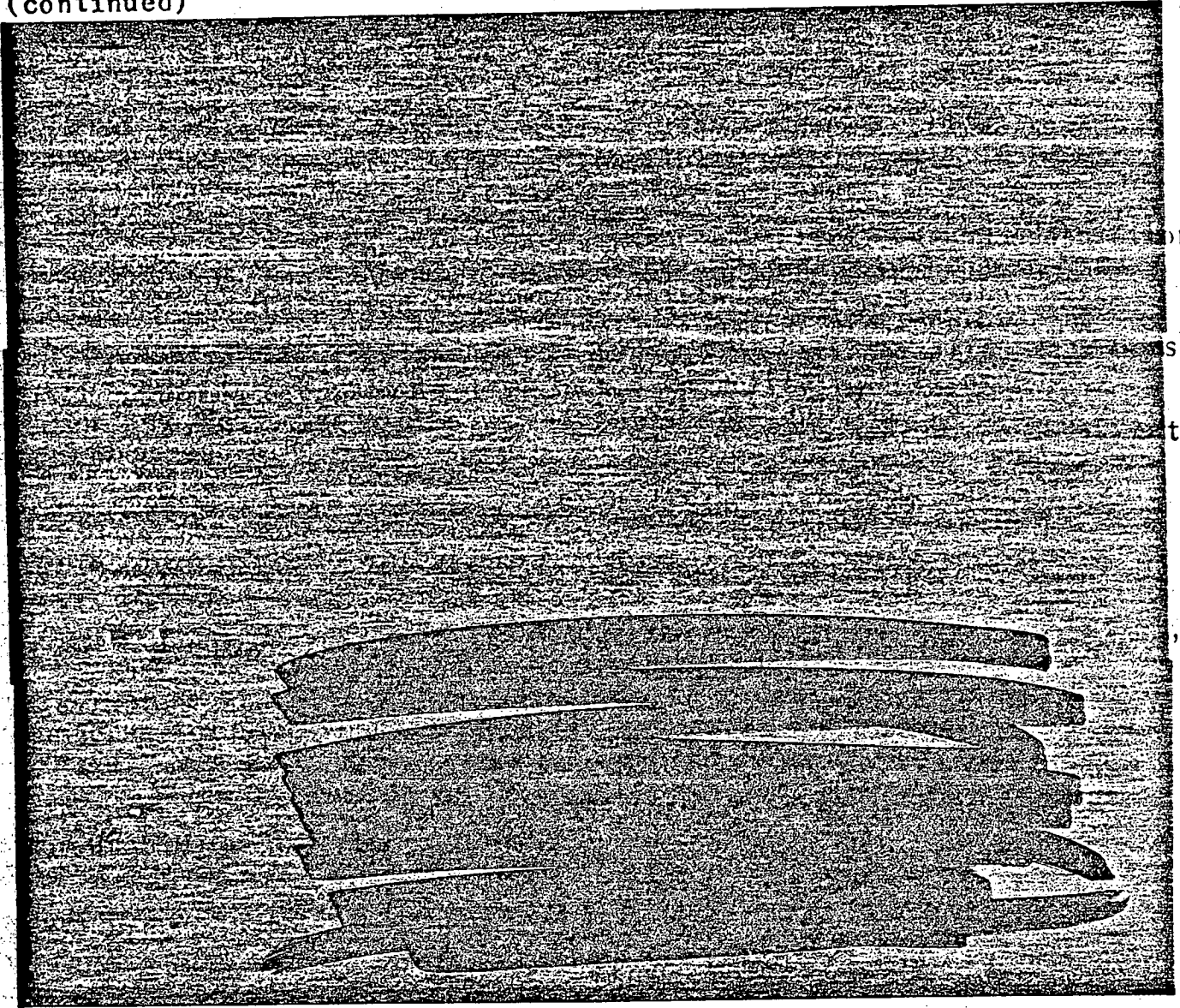

The 6/9/64, final edition of "El Mundo" carried an article stating that Santiago would be one of a committee from four independence organizations which would appear before the Anti-Colonial Committee of the UN to protest a maneuver to delay an attempt to prevent the solution of the problem of national independence and sovereignty of the Puerto Rican people. A photograph appeared with this article which showed Santiago with Mari Bras and the others.

A picture which appeared in the 7/12/64 issue of "The San Juan Star" captioned "The Protest is Still On," showed Juan Mari Bras and Ana Pales de Mendez, a suspended schoolteacher. These two individuals held a press conference to say that her reinstatement by Secretary of Education Candido Oliveras was not satisfactory because she was still considered guilty of having violated the law by engaging in political activities during school hours. Mari Bras was her attorney.



Bureau memo dated 10/30/64, captioned "Riots At the University of Puerto Rico 10/27-29/64" (105-135498) revealed that members of the FUPI, a Marxist-oriented student group at the UPR, attempted to disrupt a public meeting of anti communist students and a youth group of the Republican Statehood Party, a legitimate political party on 10/27/64.

On 10/28/64, rioting again broke out and Juan Mari Bras went to the campus and addressed the mob, promising further action.


The following references in the file captioned "Groups Seeking Independence for Puerto Rico," set forth the activities of Juan Mari Bras during the period from 7/24/60 through 11/6/64 in PR, NYC, and Washington, DC. Mari Bras, Secretary General of the MPIPR, spoke before various groups and the press. He traveled to Washington, DC and picketed the White House in connection with demands for Puerto Rican independence. Mari Bras was arrested on charges of violation of the election laws in that he operated a loudspeaker on election day. He had a long history of advocating independence for PR by violence.

MOVIMIENTO PRO INDEPENDENCIA DE PUERTO RICO
(Puerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR)

The MPIPR was organized November 23, 1959, at Ponce, Puerto Rico, according to its first Secretary General, JUAN MARI BRAS, for the independence of Puerto Rico. It was stated that the organization did not advocate violence but would accept anyone who believed in Puerto Rican independence, regardless of his beliefs as to the use of violence provided he agreed with the MPIPR Declaration of Principles.

Since its inception, the MPIPR has had as its leader and guiding force JUAN MARI BRAS who, speaking on behalf of himself and the organization, said the MPIPR does not advocate violence as a means of obtaining independence for Puerto Rico only because he felt violence would be ineffective against the power of the United States Government. He stated that he believed in the right of Puerto Rican people to use violence to obtain their freedom if and when the circumstances were such that they could possibly be successful in their efforts.

A confidential source advised that on [REDACTED], the MPIPR [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] stated that although the use of arms and violence is not presently advantageous to the Puerto Rican independence movement, the right would be reserved to use arms and violence in the future.

The MPIPR has missions throughout the island of Puerto Rico and in New York, New York; Chicago, Illinois; and Buffalo, New York. It has an estimated membership between 1,000 and 1,300 persons, according to the Police of Puerto Rico.

Since its inception, MPIPR and its leaders have frequently expressed sympathy for the communist revolution in Cuba and with the Castro Government in Cuba.

FEDERACION DE UNIVERSITARIOS PRO INDEPENDENCIA
(Federation of University Students for Independence)
(FUPI)

According to information appearing in "Patria," self-described official organ of the FUPI, the FUPI was formed as a student organization at the University of Puerto Rico (UPR), Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, in October, 1956. "Patria" stated that the FUPI was not connected with any political organization and would work for independence for Puerto Rico through logical and peaceful means.

Information received from a confidential source revealed that from 1959 to 1961 FUPI representatives attended various student conferences in foreign countries to promote the cause of independence for Puerto Rico. This source advised on May 29, 1962, that the FUPI was elected an integral member of the International Union of Students (IUS), Prague, Czechoslovakia, in October, 1960, and elected to the IUS Executive Committee, and since June, 1961, has maintained a representative, NARCISO RABELL MARTINEZ, in Prague as a member of the IUS Executive Committee, his salary and expenses paid by the IUS. According to the source, the propaganda activities of the FUPI in the international field have followed the "anti-imperialist" theme of the IUS.

The IUS has been cited by the Internal Security Sub-Committee of the Senate Judiciary Committee in 1956 as being among "international communist fronts functioning at the present time," and by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U. S. House of Representatives, in 1951, as one of the "long-established Soviet controlled international organizations."

On March 8, 1965, the above source stated that the primary objectives of the FUPI are to bring about Puerto Rican independence and achieve reform at the UPR. The source stated that the FUPI supports the principles of the Cuban Revolution to achieve national independence.

On 7/18/66, [redacted] advised during an interview that members of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico (NPPR) had recently received an anonymous letter which was, in their estimation, a "character assassination" of [redacted]. [redacted] further advised that everyone of the NPPR that had received this letter was outraged by the letter and are firmly convinced that it emanated from Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico (Puerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR) headquarters in Puerto Rico due to the fact that it contained the MPIPR expression "Despierta Boricua Defiende Lo Tuyo."

Source advised that this letter has plainly upset the members of the NPPR and they are conducting investigations in an effort to determine the source of the letter and also are presently trying to determine what action they will take against the MPIPR.
