In view of above, Chicago should be most alert to the activities of above-mentioned subjects during [REDACTED] stay in Chicago. Chicago should attempt to determine if [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Any pertinent information developed during the stay of [REDACTED] in Chicago should be furnished by most expeditious means warranted to Bureau, San Juan and any other appropriate field office.

Chicago should additionally consider immediate counterintelligence move against [REDACTED]. It is noted to [REDACTED] Chicago should consider preparing, for Chicago, an anonymous letter which would indicate these plans of [REDACTED] and consider furnishing this letter to NPPR members both in Chicago and San Juan in order to cause expulsion of [REDACTED]. Chicago should promptly submit its recommendations concerning possible counterintelligence move before proceeding with same. Chicago should be alert to the possibility of [REDACTED] between Chicago and Puerto Rico, bearing in mind that [REDACTED] would be a violation of Federal laws.

As the Bureau is aware, the factional crisis
confronting the MPIPR at this time has been given widespread
publicity in the local news media. It is further noted that
this activity most probably resulted from an editorial written
by KARI BRAS in the 3/15/70 issue of "Claridad," wherein he
condoned the assassination of US military personnel by



Re New York letter dated 9/30/70.

On 10/9/70, records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were caused to be checked by SAC [REDACTED] for information on the subject. No record was found identifiable with him.

On 10/12/70, records of the Bureau of Criminal Identification and the Special Services Division of the New York City Police Department were caused to be checked by SA [REDACTED] for a record on the subject. No record was found identifiable with him.

During October and November, 1970, the following sources, familiar with Puerto Rican independentist activities in the NYC area, were contacted for information on the subject and/or a Puerto Rican answering service who is running guns into the US. Results were negative.



In view of the fact that no positive information has been obtained in the investigation of this matter, it is apparent that the anonymous caller who reported this answering service may be the subject's wife's former husband who is attempting to cause problems for the subject. The case will, therefore, be closed and in the event further information is received on this answering service, additional investigation will be conducted.

clandestine terrorist groups and declared that the moment was near for all "patriotic" Puerto Ricans to engage in insurrection against the legitimate authorities. On 4/21/70, MARI BRAS appeared on island-wide TV where he hoped to gain more adherents for the MPIPR.

It is believed by the San Juan Office that this letter will assist in maintaining the rancor of this dispute and in further alienating MARI BRAS from the dissidents. It is the expectation of the San Juan Office that this crisis will permanently factionalize the MPIPR into small ineffective groups. ✓

Memorandum is to advise of positive results achieved against the Puerto Rican Socialist League (LSP). The LSP is a militant Red-Chinese-oriented Puerto Rican proindependence group.

During latter part of 1969, information available to Bureau indicated major disagreement existed among leaders and members of the LSP. Information also showed LSP members were questioning the leadership of [REDACTED]. Bureau at that time instructed San Juan to prepare counterintelligence move targeted against [REDACTED] and the LSP. It was felt a successful counterintelligence move against [REDACTED] and the LSP could remove from prominence this militant dangerous separatist and could weaken and/or neutralize the LSP.

San Juan prepared anonymous letter which pointed out shortcomings of [REDACTED] leadership and his indiscretions in leaking information to police source which led to arrests of a number of LSP members. Letter was so written that it was felt additional dissension would be created within the LSP. With approval of the Director, San Juan's letter was sent on 12/19/69 to selected LSP members in San Juan.

A current analysis of situation in San Juan shows a number of dissident LSP members (all of whom were recipients of our letter) have broken off from LSP and have formed a splinter group. The LSP at the moment, in view of this, is disorganized and [REDACTED] is reported attempting to recruit new members in order to restore life into the LSP. It appears reasonable to conclude this counterintelligence effort has succeeded in taking advantage of noted dissension in LSP and has created an irreparable split between [REDACTED] and a number of his most devoted lieutenants. At 12:11 a.m., 7/22/70, an anonymous telephone call was received at the Seat of Government. The caller, a male, spoke in a clear, concise manner, with no accent. The call was a local call and no background noise was heard. The caller explained that there is a Puerto Rican answering service in New York, telephone [REDACTED] who are running guns into the country and have in their possession various types of explosives. He suggested that anyone desiring to obtain information about the answering service would merely have to contact them and advise that you are interested in helping or assisting in any manner.

New York will conduct appropriate investigation to ascertain if in fact the answering service exists and if it does, will attempt to identify the individuals involved. Will advise Bureau of results of your investigation.

Re Bureau letter to San Juan, 4/16/70.

During the latter part of 1969, positive indications were developed that there existed some major disagreements among leaders and members of the Liga Socialista Puertorriqueña (Puerto Rican Socialist League) (LSP). A number of prominent LSP members were questioning the leadership of [REDACTED] and indicated that he should be replaced.

An analysis of the overall situation at that time resulted in the conclusion that the situation presented an opportunity to disrupt the organization by taking advantage of the existing situation utilizing a counterintelligence measure. An anonymous letter was composed for distribution among selected members of the LSP, including some of those who were directly involved in the disagreement described above. The letter was worded to take advantage of the disagreement and to increase the bitterness that was already developing. The letter was approved by the Bureau and subsequently mailed, on 12/19/69. Although no first hand direct report of the effect of the letter is available for lack of any sources within the organization, subsequent developments establish a significant measure of success for this counterintelligence device.

It is noted that in our continuing counterintelligence actions, a Bureau-approved anonymous mailing was made to selective LSP members with the planned objective of the disruption of the LSP.

Advise if our counterintelligence move was responsible for the apparent disruption of the LSP. Additionally, furnish your assessment of the current strength of the LSP in view of the separation of certain of its members who now comprise captioned group.

Extra copies of this letter being furnished San Juan for your files concerning the LSP and counterintelligence matters.
