On January 13, 1969, a confidential source of the Fin Juan Office who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that on January 11, 1969, the Movimiento Pro-Independencia de Puerto Rico (Fuerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR) sponsored a commemoration of Eugenio Maria de Hostos Day at Mayaguez, Puerto Rico.

> A characterization of the MPIFR is contained in the appendix pages attached hereto.

Eugenio Maria de Hostos was a 19th century Puerto Rican revolutionary leader and philosopher. His birth date is commemorated on January 11th of each year.

Approximately 300 people attended the commemoration, which was held at the Cultural Center, Mayaguez, Puerto Rico. In attendance were MPIPR members from reversal missions throughout the island. Also in attendance ombers of the Fartide Independentista Puertorriquence (Just dence Party of Puerto Rico) (PIP) as well as persons not directly associated ith any independence group.

The main speakers were Francisco Manrique Cabrera, a member of the MPIPR Political Commission, and Juan Mari Bras, the MPIPR Secretary General.

Manrique Cabrera delivered a summary of the life and works of Eugenio Maria de Hostos.

Juan Mari Bras spoke on the development of the PR during the part isn years. Mari Bras stated that the MPIPR had gained great success in their campaign against compulsory military service and that in the not too distant future, young men in Puerto Rico will not be subject to the United States Selective Service System. Mari Bras outlined other campaigns such as the electoral strike and the campaign to stop exploitation of Puerto Rican mines by United States business interests.

Mari Bras said that the struggle for independence in Puerto Rico would become more intense during the next ten years. In addition, he stated that the imperialist yankees had contracted gangsters to attack the WPIPR and that "Cuban Power" had declared war on the MPIPR. Nati Bras also stated that the MPIPR will fight for independence by any means necessary.

After the speech by Juan Mari Bras, two short films on Che Guevara, the deceased Cuban revolutionary, whown to all these present.

There were no disturbances or incidents reported.

In the November 26, 1968, edition of "El Mundo," a Spanish language daily newspaper printed in San Juan, it was reported that subject will be the principal speaker at the inaugural session of the Memispheric Conference to End the War in Vietnam, to be held in Montreal, Canada, from November 29, 1968, through December 1, 1968.

In the December 4, 1968, Number 381, edition of the "Carta Semanal" an article written by the subject entitled, "MOVIMIENTO PRO-INDEPENDENCIA DE PUERTO RICO (PUERTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MPIPR) Head a Hemispheric Conference in Favor of Vietnam" appeared, and translated from Spanish as follows:

> "OUR BEST HELP TO THE HEROIC VIETNAM IS TO NOT PERMIT ONE MINUTE OF PEACE FOR THE IMPERIALISM IN PUERTO RICO - MARI BRAS words at the Plenary Meeting

"When addressing the plenary session of the Hemispheric Conference of Solidarity with the Country of Vietnam, which took place last weekend in Montreal, Quebec, the Secretary-General of the Independence Movement, JUAN MARI BRAS, stated that the most effective solidarity which we can offer the Vietnam people is to increase the struggle to defeat imperialism and its up anditional servants in each one of our countries in the Americas. 'The Independence Movement assures the Vietnamese

that the purpose of our organization is not to permit one minute of peace for Yankee imperialism in Puerto Rico. 4 MARI explained the extraordinary development of the resistance against the compulsory military service on the part of the Puerto Rican youth, and described the different forms of struggle with which the Puerto Rican people, through their vanguards, is giving blows, more effective each time, to the American intervening regime in our country. The delegates of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam and the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam. who attended the conference told the Puerto Rican delegates that they were grateful for the solidarity actions which take place here, which they said they had perfect knowledge of."

The MPIPR "Carta Semanal" is self-described as the official weekly letter from MPIPR Headquarters to the officials of its branch missions.

On December 1, 1968, subject arrived at San Juan International rport from New York City after making a connecting flight from intreal, Canada.

IV. ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE MOVIMLENTO PRO-INDEPENDENCIA DE PUERTO RICO (FUERTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MFIPR)

On July 24, 1968, subject was in attendance at a public meeting held in front of National Mission Headquarters, Rio Piedras, at which time he urged all Puerto Rican youth to reject compulsory military service and denounced exploitation of Puerto Rican mineral resources by United States mining interests.

On August 3, 1968, subject was the main speaker at a public meeting held in Penuelas, Puerto Ricc, where he denounced the arrest of CRUZ SANTIAGO, a member of the Penuelas Mission of the MFIPR by the Police of Puerto Rico on fire bombing charges. He also charged the Police of Fuerto Rico with police brutality.

August 9, 1968

On August 10, 1968, subject was the main speaker at a public meeting held in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico. At this time, the subject spoke regarding the electoral strike advocated by the MPIPR; the war in Vietnam; United States mining interest; police brutality of the Police of Puerto Rico; and compulsory military service, and Yankse imperialism. Approximately one hundred people attended the musting.

At this assembly, the subject spoke of the life and works OF FEDRO ALBIZU CAMPOS. Deptember 13, 1968 PEDRO ALBIZU CAMPOS was the titular head of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico (NPPR). He died of natural causes on April 21, 1965. The NPPR has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. On November 19, 1968, subject was the main speaker at a public meeting held at the Plaza De Colon, San Juan, Puerto Rico. The purpose of this assembly was to protest obligatory military service. The spect was delivered directly in front of the United Etates Post Office, mich also houses Selective Service Headquarters.

Subject praised the Puerto Rican youths who have refused to be inducted into the United States military service. Approximately four hundred people were in attendance.

#### C. Demonstrations

On June 27, 1968, subject participated in a picket in iront of the Humacao Jail, Humacao, Puerto Rico. The picket was held to protest the incarceration of CRUZ DEL CARMEN and VICTOR SOTO, members of the MPIPR accused of having set fire to the Pueblo and Grand Union Supermarkets in Caguas, <u>Puerto Rico</u>. The subject gave a speech wherein he criticized the Police of Puerto Rico, and stated nothing or no one would stop the MPIPR in its struggle for independence.

## SJ T-1 July 10, 1968

On August 24, 1968, subject was in attendance at a rally at Cabo Rojo, Puerto Rico, at which time he delivered a speech attacking compulsory military service and the Federal judicial system. Approximately three hundred to four hundred people were in attendance.

On September 23, 1968, subject was in attendance at a commemoration of "Grito de Lares" held at Lares, Puerto Rico. The subject was one of several guest speakers. During the course of his talk, he verbally supported the Comandos Armados de Liberacion (Armed Commandos of Liberation) (CAL). Approximately five thousand people were 1. attendance at this commemoration.

The CAL is a Puerto Rican independence seeking group that claims to be responsible for the recent wave of incendiarism and bombings occurring in Puerto Rico since 10/67. CAL disclaims any affiliation with any known separatist group and alleges their complete operation is clandestine.

#### D. Miscellaneous Activity

On August 14, 1968, subject was the main speaker at a Federacion de Universitarios pro-Independencia (Federation of University Students for Independence) (FUFI) sponsored rally held at the Santa Rita section of Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico. Subject attacked the present administration at the University of Puerto Rico at Rio Piedras, and defended all those who were involved in the riot at the University of Puerto Rico in September of 1967.

#### V. PUBLIC STATEMENTS AND DECLARATIONS BY SUBJECT

In the September 24, 1968, edition of the "San Juan Star," An English language daily newspaper printed in San Juan, following statement was attributed to the subject during a speech he Celiveria on September 23, 1968, at Lares, Puerto Rico: "From this platform in Lares, Puerto Rico, the MPIFR salutes our fellow Puerto Ricans who make up the Comandos Armados de Liberacion (CAL). The MPIFR does not pretend to bring independence alone. Each group must bring about the crisis within the empire in its own way."

In the June 6, 1968, edition of the "San Juan Star" it was reported that on June 5, 1968, the subject testified before the Puerto Rico Civil Rights Commission and stated that the MPIPR is being persecuted according to a Federal plan to eliminate groups it considers enemies of the American political system. He also stated the persecution ranges from 24 hours police vigilance, to break-ins, to wire tapping, to kidnaping by the police. He said he is followed constantly and when he goes to the mainland he is always accompanied by an FBI Agent.

On October 24, 1968, subject appeared on a panel at the Mayaguer campus of the University of Puerto Rico and spoke on the MPIPR proposed electoral strike, exploitation of Puerto Rican matural

On January 7, 1969 Puerto Rico, advised that a bomb had exploded in a vehicle owned by JUAN MARI BRAS. The vehicle involved Sta a 1967 Ford Falcon registered to subject's wife, PAQUITA SQUERA DE MARI. The explosion took place at approximately Elg a.m. in front of subject's residence. Damages totaled \$200 and no injuries were reported.

On January 27, 1969, advised that investigation to date has been negative in establishing a suspect or suspects in the bombing of subject's automobile. LUGO further stated in view of the lack of suspects in this matter and the fact that all logical investigation has been conducted with negative results, the case has been placed in a closed status.

## STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

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COMPLETIN

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, In June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, Delifornia, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some sommunists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

On April 16, 1969, SJ T-1, a source of the San Juan Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on April 16, 1969, at Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, Mari Bras delivered the main address at the commemoration of Jose de Diego Day. Mari Bras stated that militants in favor of independence have been doing an effective job for liberation in the last few years. In particular, he stated that they are fighting the draft. He further stated "this is an excellent example of the resistance that youth shows against unwanted presence of the military on the Island."

During the commemoration Piri Fernandez de Lewis, a leader of the Sixto Alvelo Committee, also spoke concerning ways that Puerto Rican youth could avoid the draft.

No incidents were reported and approximately 200 people attended the commemoration.

## MOVINIENTO PRO-INDEPENDENCIA DE PUERTO RICO (PUERTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MPIPR)

The MPIFR was organized in November, 1959, at Ponce, Fuerto Rico, to work for the independence of Puerto Rico. It has an estimated membership of between 1,000 and 1,300 people with missions throughout the Island of Puerto Rico and in New York, New York; Chicago, Illinois; and Buffalo, New York.

At the time the MFIPR was organized, it indicated that it did not advocate violence but would accept members who did. JUAN MARI ERAS, the founder and dominant leader of this organization, in a speech during March, 1964, threatened violence comparable to that in Algeria, 1964, if Puerto Rico became a state within the United States. A source reported in 1966 that a leader of the MPIFR has indicated that "the Revolution" would soon begin and woother source advised that another official of this organization has attempted to obtain a number of automatic pistols.

Articles praising FIDEL CASTRO and the Cuban Government regularly appear in the MPIPR publications. In 1961, the MFIPR adopted a resolution expressing a 100 percent approval of and solidarity with the Guban revolution. It sent a delegation to the Gri-Continental Conference of African, Asian, and Latin American People, held in Ravana, Guba, during January, 1965, and it maintains a permanent delegate to the Secretariat located in Havana.

The press of Puerto Rico has reported that the MPIPR bas held numerous demonstrations protesting compulsory military service of Puerto Ricans and United States policy in Vietnam and the Dominican Republic.

In December, 1955, the Governor of Puerto Rico signed into law a bill calling for a plebiscite on July 23, 1957, to determine the future political status of Fuerto Rico. The plebiscite, denounced vociferously by the MPIFR as "an act of Yankee imperialism to maintain the colonial status of Fuerto Rico," Feculted in an overwhelming endorsement of the present Free Associated State status.



## MPIPR

Resolutions adopted at the 7th National Assembly held in late April, 1968, at San Juan, Puerto Rico, included expressions of solidarity with the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam and promises of material support in the form of medicine and money. Also included were a resolution of solidarity with "Black Power" in the United States, and an expression of solidarity with the "National Liberation" movements in Venezuela, Colombia, and Guatemala.

The note went on to state that the above four would be first on the list they were prepared to liquidate and cautioned Juan Mari Bras he would be first and nothing could save him. Florencio Merced is the President of Federacion de Universitarios Pro-Independencia 🗊 (FUPI), which is the college-level arm of the MPIPR. Tono and the MPIPR. Gonzalez is President of the Partido Union Puertorriqueno (PUP), which was formed in Puerto Rico in April, 1969, to obtain independence for Puerto Rico by peaceful means. Ruben Berrios is a member of the Presidential Commission of the Partido Independentista Puertorriqueno (PIP), a former political party in Puerto Rico which advocates independence for Puerto Rico through legal and peaceful means,
